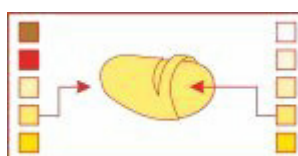
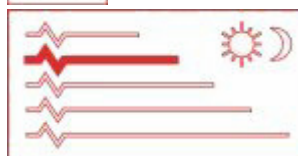


General production advice ware potatoes

- * Fast skin set



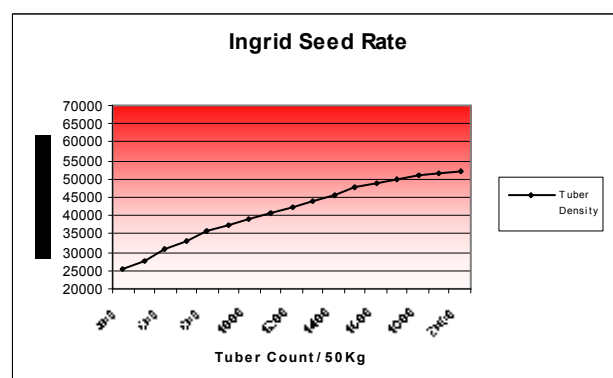

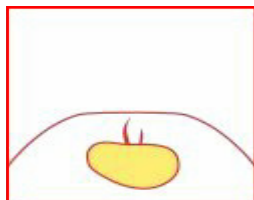
Fertiliser

Nutrient requirements are similar to Premiere. Advise 200kg N/ha including soil supply. Not necessary to use split applications of N.

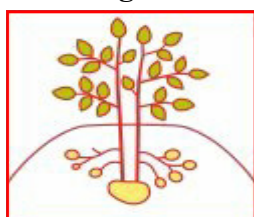

Pre-treatment and planting



Ingrid is suitable for a range of soil types although heavy soils with a poor structure may result in misshapen tubers..
Although Ingrid is an early variety pre sprouting is beneficial, to advance growth and maturity, if aiming at an early market. If sprouted ensure that soil temperatures are above 6oC at planting to minimize the risk of Little Potato Disorder
Treatment against Rhizoctonia is recommended.
The variety is not susceptible to greening, therefore can be planted at a normal depth..

Growing attention points



Ingrid is slightly susceptible to foliage blight, but has good resistance to tuber blight.
However a robust blight programme is still recommended.

Haulm killing and harvest



Ingrid is a robust variety which sets its skin quickly. It can therefore be harvested either green-top as a loose skin pack potato or left to mature and packed as early set skin.

Storage



Ingrid has a good dormancy, although the variety is best suited to off the field use.
